

NATURAL JEWELS OF THE CARIBBEAN-NORTHBOUND – 8 DAYS/7 NIGHTS

DAY 1- GRENADA

Our adventure starts today! We will be at the meeting point by 16:00 to transfer to Klara. After embarking and settling into our cabins, we will gather for cocktails to meet our fellow travellers, followed by dinner. Grenada is often referred to as the “Spice Isle,” as it is home to numerous nutmeg plantations. St. George is the island’s capital and showcases colourful homes, Georgian buildings and early-18th-century Fort George overlooking Carenage Harbour. Spectacular waterfalls and beaches, lush botanical gardens, mystic rainforests, and friendly people at every turn, will give us an introduction to the amazing places we will be visiting during our journey.

DAY 2 – ST VICENT AND THE GRENADIERS

Today we plan to land at the Blue Lagoon harbour to visit the King’s Hill Forest Reserve. King’s Hill Forest Reserve was established by way of act on April 2nd, 1791. Considered one of the oldest forest reserves in the Western Hemisphere, it is home to a variety of trees and shrubs and provides a home for protected wildlife.

DAY 3 – ST LUCIA

Saint Lucia, with her blend of beauty and mystique, enchants every visitor who steps onto her shores. As the only sovereign nation named after a woman, Saint Lucia embodies a spirit of adventure and inspiration. Visitors to this tropical paradise often find themselves deeply touched by its allure, making them both reluctant to leave and eager to return. Today we plan to call into Marigot Bay, an off the beaten track seaside settlement, located on the edge of a sheltered inlet, lined by hills it offers some spectacular hiking trails.

DAY 4 – MARTINIQUE

The island of Martinique with a rich colonial past, offers a mix of leisure and adventure, showcasing idyllic beaches located steps away from historical sites and lush mountains. Waters surrounding Martinique have a rich diverse marine life, we may even spot a large pod of dolphins playing around. Today we plan to visit Les Anses D’Arlet, a charming fishing community with traditional Creole houses made of coloured wood and peeling tiles. Along the shore skiffs and nets are a reminder of a working fishermen’s village.

DAY 5 – GUADELOUPE

Today we plan to call into Basse-Terre, nestled within a volcanic range crowned by La Soufrière, it is surrounded by dense tropical vegetation. The 17,000 hectares of rainforest that cover the mountain range are part of the National Park, which boasts numerous hiking trails. These trails, some easily accessible through a rich ecosystem teeming with an impressive variety of endemic species. In this verdant paradise, you will find breathtaking waterfalls and a myriad of friendly species.

Complementing its natural beauty, Basse-Terre is fringed with beaches of white, black, gold, and even pink sands.

DAY 6 – ANTIGUA

Antigua ringed with coral reefs, is known for its sandy beaches ideal for snorkel and SUP. Set along English Harbour, you will find the restored Nelson's Dockyard, which Admiral Horatio Nelson made his base in the 1780s, including a marina and the Dockyard Museum. As we hike up to Shirley Heights, a restored military lookout and gun battery. The Lookout is a high point (about 490 ft.), and it is said to boast the best views of English and Falmouth Harbours. Devil's Bridge is a natural rock arch located near Indian Town Point. Around the arch we will see natural blowholes which shoot up water and spray powered by waves from the Atlantic Ocean.

DAY 7 – NEVIS

The first Indigenous inhabitants were the Arawak and the Carib. The Arawak named the Island Dulcina (sweet island), the Carib named it Oualie (land of beautiful waters). A few centuries later as it became a leading sugar producer, the name changed to Nevis (Queen of the Caribbees). The Botanical gardens are worth a visit, created by an American couple Joseph and Martha Murphy, displays sculptures, fountains, a replica of a Great House, a tropical rain forest conservatory design at the image of the conservatory at Kew Gardens in England. One will come away certain that Nevis is the hidden gem of the Caribbean Islands. Historical sites, ruins dating back to early 17th century, breathtaking landscapes, spectacular views from the top of Nevis Peak, bamboo fields, cocoa trees. rainforest waterfalls - Nevis has it all!
